Dear Chairman Cole and Ranking Member DeLauro:

We are writing to thank the Subcommittee for its past support of the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS), and to respectfully request that you support increased funding for CNCS at the national service community-recommended level of \$1.46 billion for fiscal year 2017.

As you know, CNCS administers AmeriCorps, Senior Corps, VISTA, NCCC, the Social Innovation Fund, and the Volunteer Generation Fund and is the nation's leading grant provider for service and volunteering. Working hand in hand with thousands of local partners, CNCS programs engage more than 344,000 national service participants in results-driven service at more than 50,000 locations across the country each year. These dedicated Americans recruit and manage more than five million additional volunteers as they work to create jobs, deliver disaster relief, prepare a better-trained workforce, promote health, strengthen our economy, and improve communities nationwide.

National service harnesses the energy and ingenuity of our nation's most valuable resource – our citizens – to bolster the capacity of the social and public sectors to address local needs and save taxpayer dollars. A study by economists at Columbia University found that, for every dollar invested in national service, there is a \$3.95 return to society in terms of higher earnings, increased output and other community-wide benefits. In fact, national service programs are among the largest employers of young Americans, allowing participants to gain marketable job skills and experience and to increase their employability and earning potential. Service programs also benefit the unemployed: CNCS found that unemployed individuals who volunteer are 27 percent more likely to secure employment than those who do not volunteer.

National service is a public-private partnership which recognizes that no one sector can meet our challenges alone, and that America is at its best when citizens work together joined in common purpose. The resources provided by CNCS, matched by significant support from the private sector, are helping organizations across the country work in creative ways to tackle our most persistent and costly challenges by:

- Assisting with relief and rebuilding efforts after natural disasters, including the devastating floods in South Carolina and Missouri this past year; the water emergency in Flint, Michigan; and long-term recovery for other disaster-stricken communities such as those in Eastern Kentucky;
- Serving nearly 750,000 veterans and military families, by helping them access benefits, services and job training, and ensuring their children receive mentoring and tutoring assistance;
- Increasing access to safe, affordable housing for thousands of families;
- Providing additional student support in one out of four persistently low achieving schools;
- Harnessing the skills and wisdom of older generations to provide over 800,000 seniors and Americans with disabilities with in-home support;
- Bolstering civic and faith-based organizations by supporting evidence based-solutions;
- Creating pathways to employment and a pipeline of citizen leaders.

For all these reasons, we urge you to fund CNCS at the community-requested level of \$1.46 billion for FY 2017. Thank you for your consideration.
